"I have made wonderful friends that I will cherish for years to come," she added. Ara Jamgochian, owner of the Claddagh said, "we received about 30 hours from volunteers when we could not find anyone to help." The outpouring of help touched Lynn Weber of Nauvoo Cottages, "It was amazing that people would be that giving to complete strangers," she added.
